Forest City, Iowa – See the past in action September 18-20 as **Heritage Park of North Iowa** presents the 26th annual **Steam Threshing and Old Iron Swap Days**.

Heritage Park of North Iowa, a project of the Winnebago Historical Society, is located on 90 acres of land on the south edge of Forest City. Heritage Park will present demonstrations of a bygone era. Antique steam traction engines, big gas tractors and flywheel engines will be operational, powering the machines they were built for - plowing, grain threshing, and saw milling. Other demonstrations include sorghum pressing, shingle making, horsepower testing, corn shelling, clover hulling, bean threshing and feed grinding all powered using antique gas tractors and flywheel gas engines. Draft horses will be on hand to power 1880's horsepower equipment including a threshing machine, hay press and a single horse treadmill. Numerous other family oriented activities are also planned.

The National Sheppard Diesel Club will be hosting their 15th Annual show at this year's event. 100 Sheppard Diesel tractors are expected to participate. Also the North American Scale Model Exhibition will be holding their 2nd annual event at the show this year. In addition, the John Deere farm equipment will also be featured. Over 200 tractors are expected to be on display. Plowing with big steam engines and large prairie gas tractors will again be one of the big crowd pleaser. A Parade of Power will be held Saturday and Sunday afternoon when the large steamers and gas tractors will parade around the show grounds providing fantastic photo opportunities of the operating machines.

Permanent building displays include a barn that has been restored and packed with items one would see in a turn-of-the-century barn. The Blacksmith Shop, Fire Station, Gas Station, School Buildings, Church, Log Cabins, Jailhouse, Barber Shop and other buildings will be open for viewing and reminiscing. New this year is a print shop. Nondenominational Church services will be held Sunday Morning at 9:00 AM.

Entertainment featuring area entertainers will be provided starting at 1:00 PM on Saturday and Sunday. Gary Froiland will entertain both Saturday and Sunday afternoons. Gary will also provide music for the Saturday night barn dance as well as gospel music at Sunday's church service.

On Friday the 18th, starting at 1:00 PM a consignment auction consisting of antique tractors, cars, farm machinery, parts, literature, tools, toys, etc. will be held. Fox Auction Company from Mason City has donated their services and will be conducting the auction. There is still time to consign items! All commissions charged for the sale will go directly to Heritage Park of North Iowa. Anyone wanting to consign items should contact David Hill at (641)590-5959 or Wyndham Sellers (641-357-0359). A Craft Show as well as vendors of tools, tractor and engine parts, and a variety of other items will also be on hand throughout the three day event.

Food service will be provided throughout the days. Homemade ice cream will be made using a steam engine for power. The steam-made ice cream is always a crowd pleaser; both eating the ice cream and seeing the steam engine make the ice cream are a delight for all.

Gates will open at 8:00 AM each day. Admission will be charged on Saturday and Sunday. Admission on Friday is free and after 6:00 PM on Saturday and 4:00 PM on Sunday. Children 13 and under are admitted free all the time. Souvenirs are available for purchase at a nominal cost. Raffle tickets for a restored John Deer A tractor will be available for purchase. A bologna sausage and all you can eat corn feed, cooked with a steam engine, is planned for Saturday evening starting after the parade of power. The feed will continue past 6:00 PM when admission is no longer charged. A detailed schedule of the different activities and events will be provided on the show grounds. Rest assured there will always be something happening for young and old alike.

Exhibitors of antique farm and construction-related equipment are invited to display their equipment at any and all shows. Exhibitors will be admitted at no charge.
